FOR THE GUIDANCE OF DELEGATES

RULES OF DEBATE

- (1) Delegates desiring to speak shall rise in their places and address the Chair. If two or more Delegates rise to speak at the same time, the Chairman shall decide who is entitled to priority.
- (2) A Delegate desiring to speak will announce his/her Name and the Club represented.
- (3) Whenever the Chairman shall rise during a debate, any Delegate then on his/her feet shall resume their seat, and the Meeting will keep silent so that the Chairman may be heard without interruption.
- (4) The debate shall be confined to the particular question before the Meeting, whether it be a Motion or an Amendment. No Delegate shall digress from the subject matter of the question immediately under discussion, or improperly interrupt a debate.
- (5) The Chairman may, before stating the same from the Chair, require the Mover of a Motion to hand it to him in writing, and may also require the subdivision of the text of a complicated Motion or Amendment.
- (6) A Delegate, subject to these orders, may speak to any question before the Meeting, but may not speak more than once on any question except in reply by the Mover of a Motion.
- (7) After a Motion has been Moved and Seconded, and stated from the Chair, any Delegate who has not spoken to such Motion may propose an Amendment thereto, such Amendment having been Seconded, shall then be proposed as a new question from the Chair.

BOWLS TARANAKI (INC.)

Minutes of the 110th Annual General Meeting of Delegates held at Stratford-Avon Bowling Club on Saturday 24th June 2023, commencing at 9.30 a.m

PRESENT: The Chairman, Robert Wolfe, presided over an attendance of 32 delegates and 16 observers. The Chairman specifically welcomed the delegates and observers, Patron and Life Member Patty Symes and Life Member Brien Bennett QSM.

CLUBS NOT REPRESENTED: Awakino, Oakura, Patea, Waimea and Urenui.

BEREAVEMENTS: The Chairman asked those present to stand and observe a moment's silence in memory of the well-known bowlers and servants of the game who had passed away during the year.

APOLOGIES: Apologies were received from Allan Hunt, Chris Commane, Pauline Madgwick, Neil Earley, Simon Rowe, Maurice Symes, Moe Kelly, Gary Lilley, Allan Batley, Don Christensen. On the motion of Gordon Lawson/Faye Hopkins the apologies were accepted. **CARRIED**

REFRESHMENTS: The Chairman advised that refreshments will be provided after the AGM, and thanked the Stratford-Avon Bowling Club for their hospitality.

RULES OF DEBATE: The Chairman reminded delegates about the voting procedure and the Rules of Debate that had been circulated. There were no objections.

MINUTES: On the Motion of Jono Burrows/Gordon Lawson, the Minutes of the 2022 AGM, having been circulated, were taken as read and approved as a true and correct record. **CARRIED**

REPORTS AND STATEMENTS OF ACCOUNTS:

President's Report and Chairman's Report: Moved Jono Burrows/Mike Sherning that the Reports which had been circulated to all Delegates be taken as Read and Approved. **CARRIED**

Annual Financial Statements: The President, Grant Hassall, spoke briefly to the accounts saying that there was a small loss after depreciation, however we did have a small trading surplus prior to depreciation. Due to inflation, increased costs were incurred and paid out to clubs more for catering and refreshments for the Taranaki Open Fours. Costs for handbooks, travel and accommodation for Rep Tournaments have increased but thanks to Kiwi Gaming Foundation and Pelorus Trust, grants allowed us to cover most of the expenses for the Representative teams. Overall the accounts show a reasonable outcome for the year.

It was Moved Martin Jordan/Cindy Nicoll that the Annual Financial Statements for 2022-23 be approved. **CARRIED**

CLUB LEVIES: The Chairman advised that the Board had resolved that there be a small increase in levies from \$22+GST to \$24+GST per full playing member, and a small increase to the green levy from \$10 to \$15+GST per green for the three affiliates (Umpires, Coaches and Greenkeepers Associations).

The Chairman called for any questions or discussion on the levy – there were no objections to the proposed increase.

NOTICES OF MOTIONS: None were received.

ELECTION OF OFFICERS:

Patron: It was moved by Faye Hopkins/Julie Hemahema that Mrs. Patty Symes be appointed as Patron. Patty Symes accepted and spoke briefly to the assembled delegates. **CARRIED**

President: Mr. Grant Hassall (West End) was elected unopposed.

Vice President:

Megan Peters, Brien Bennett and Patty Symes were appointed scrutineers for a vote for the election of a Vice President.

Nominees, David Brunton and Kristin Stampa addressed the meeting.

The vote was held, with Kristin Stampa winning the ballot 18 votes to 9. Kristin Stampa was elected as Vice President. It was resolved that the voting papers be destroyed. Moved by Mike Sherning/Julie Hemahema **CARRIED**

APPOINTMENTS TO THE CENTRE BOARD:

The delegates were informed that Kevin Gray, Robert Wolfe and Dean File were appointed to the Board for the next 2 years. Chris Commane and Val McEldowney have one further year to run on their appointments.

FINANCIAL REVIEWER: It was moved by Gordon Lawson/Tina Quilter that the financial reviewer be retained as VanBurWray Chartered Accountants for the coming season. **CARRIED**

DRAFT CENTRE PROGRAMME:

The Draft Centre Programme for 2023-24 was accepted. Moved by Cliff Rona/Faye Hopkins. **CARRIED**

REPORTS:

The Board received a written report from the Women's Selector.

Umpires: David Brunton, President of the Umpires Association, read a report to the AGM.

Greenkeepers: Ian Lewis read a report received from Gary Lilley, the President of the Greenkeepers Association.

Coaches: Ian Lewis read a report from Moe Kelly, the President of the Coaches Association.

GENERAL BUSINESS:

Midlands Funds Management: It was announced that the Board had secured Midlands Funds Management as a major sponsor for Bowls Taranaki and the Taranaki Men's Open Fours for the next two years with a right of renewal for one further year.

Incorporated Societies Act: After a question about updating club constitutions, it was advised that Mark Cameron from Bowls New Zealand was in attendance and would update the delegates after the meeting with regards the work that they are doing to update a model club constitution, so that clubs can keep in line with the incoming changes to the Incorporated Society Act.

Men's Shield: After a brief discussion, a show of hands revealed that clubs were in favour of draws continuing to count by 8 votes to 3.

Delaying start to season: A letter was received from the Greenkeeper's Association. It was read to the meeting by Ian Lewis. It recommended trying to hold off from using green's too early in the season, so as to prevent damage to greens from players 'dumping' their bowls when delivering. The Chairman asked that clubs and divisions take this matter into consideration when setting their programmes. There was no further discussion.

I take pleasure in presenting this report following another successful season of Bowling in our Province. Now that the “summer season” has finished planning has already commenced for the next seasons play, which is programmed to commence in September (only 3 months away).

I would like to acknowledge the time given by all Board Members for their commitment to managing our sport on behalf of the 21 clubs & their members. While never easy to please all participants, I can assure you all there has always been a lot of thought & constructive debate around the Board table before any decisions are finalised. To this extent, the knowledge & experience of members is always valued & with President Grant & his over-view of the financial management we are indeed fortunate here in Taranaki. Executive Officer Ian, has managed the day to day operations extremely well & we as bowlers should be thankful that we have a person of his calibre working for us. Our Umpires Assn, Coaches Assn, Greenkeepers Assn, Youth Bowls Group & Divisional Committees have again been an essential part of our operations & along with the Club Management groups & volunteers are a contributing factor for the success & enjoyment for the players & supporter alike. Visits to Patea & Awakino BCs during the season indicated to me that playing bowls is strong in those outer areas even if they do not have regular participants in our Taranaki Competitions.

We had a “ground-breaking” season with Midlands Funds Management & The Devon Hotel being associated with our Flagship Events, the Taranaki Open Men’s 4s & Taranaki Women’s Open 4s & along with many other businesses who have supported our Centre Events I express the Boards thanks. To demonstrate the high regard these events, hold on the NZ calendar, entries were attracted from throughout the country & as usual several Australian Teams were participating. The Midlands Funds Management men’s 4s was taken out by a local Paritutu team, skipped by Darren Goodin, the New Plymouth Club consolation pairs title going to Te Atatu with a Bannockburn pair runner up. The Devon Hotel women’s 4s won by an Omokoroa 4 skipped by Sue Hodges, Thames Coast 4 skipped by Kay Bunn being runners up & the consolation pairs was a trans-Tasman battle between the Tower junior pair of Alethea Rowlands & Irene Taunt who were narrowly defeated by the experienced Pine Rivers (Nth Queensland) pair of Sue Brady & Terry McAlary. The fortnight in which these men & women’s events take place is truly seen as a BUCKET LIST fixture for many.

Once again Bowls Taranaki was afforded the opportunity to host National Events, the Summerset National 4s & Summerset National Mixed Pairs, NZ Para Nationals & NZ Deaf Bowls Nationals. These 4 events attracted a whole new group of players to this province & the efforts put in by the Bowling Clubs used, was certainly appreciated & I would say, gave the province a very big financial lift during all of the days of attendance by participants. The positive comments received for what our province provided should serve us well going towards future Taranaki Bowling events. While no local bowlers

managed to win National Titles in these events, several were right up there at the business end of the championships.

On behalf of the Board I must highlight a growing group of younger players who have further promoted Taranaki's image as a New Zealand nursery for up & coming players. The Taranaki under 26 age team consisting of Briar Atkinson, Luca Dobson, Cameron Horo, Nathan Goodin & Aidan Zittersteijn & managed by Selector Simon Rowe, were successful in winning the inaugural Un 26 NZ tournament hosted in Wellington (June last year). Cameron Horo won the NZ Kitty Hawk singles, Briar Atkinson won the NZ Champ of Champions singles, Taranaki Junior Sportswomen of the Year & named in the NZ Bowls Emerging Players group. Naming of Briar, Kaylin Huwyler, Hamish Kapi & Kurt Smith for the NZ High Performance Squad was just reward, from our younger stock of bowlers, & is certainly an achievement in itself as Taranaki names where prominent in many other Centre fixtures throughout the season.

The demands placed on the day-to-day operation of our sport is ever increasing & a SPECIAL THANKS must be extended to all who support, whether by way of sponsorship, advertising or with voluntary work as we strive to provide in the sport & recreation field, we could not operate without you. I do urge all Clubs, Members & Supporters to support those who have seen fit to support us &, if possible, let them know you are aligned to the sport of Outdoor Bowls when doing so. With the numbers of casual bowlers increasing amongst the clubs I'm sure opportunities will arise for all.

National

Most pleasingly, a number of players waved the Taranaki flag away from home:

- In July 2023, Briar Atkinson won the New Zealand champion-of-champions women's singles in Hastings. This was the high-point of Taranaki's involvement in the champion-of-champions.

- Briar Atkinson was named New Zealand Emerging Player of the Year.
- Briar Atkinson attended the Hong Kong International Classic, making the last 16 of the women's singles and the last six of the women's pairs with Selina Goddard.
- Briar Atkinson was named Taranaki junior sportswoman of the year in November.
- Briar Atkinson (Paritutu), Hamish Kape (Okato), Kaylin Huwyler (Durie Hill Whanganui and Paritutu) and Kurt William Smith (Oakura and Paritutu) were selected in the 44-strong Bowls New Zealand High Performance squad for the season.
- At the Summerset Nationals in Christchurch, Briar Atkinson (Paritutu) was runner-up in the women's pairs with Tannith Potgieter (Durie Hill) and third-equal in the women's singles.
- Camron Horo won the Kittyhawks boy's singles title.
- Briar Atkinson won the New Zealand under-21 singles in Wellington, with Nathan Goodin third-equal.
- Taranaki successfully hosted the Summerset National fours and mixed pairs in late February, with 18 clubs used and Paritutu acting as headquarters. Many visitors were highly complimentary of the experience. In the fours, Briar Atkinson, leading for Selina Goddard (Takapuna), was third-equal. In the mixed pairs, Trish Howard and John Garrud (West End) were runners-up.



Basis of Preparation

The entity has elected to apply PBE SFR-A (NFP) Public Benefit Entity Simple Format Reporting - Accrual (Not-For-Profit) on the basis that it does not have public accountability and has total annual expenses equal to or less than \$2,000,000. All transactions in the Performance Report are reported using the accrual basis of accounting. The Performance Report is prepared under the assumption that the entity will continue to operate in the foreseeable future.

Goods and Services Tax (GST)

The entity is registered for GST. All amounts are stated exclusive of goods and services tax (GST) except for accounts payable and accounts receivable which are stated inclusive of GST.

Income Tax

Bowls Taranaki Inc is wholly exempt from New Zealand income tax having fully complied with all statutory conditions for these exemptions.

Bank Accounts and Cash

Bank accounts and cash in the Statement of Cash Flows comprise cash balances and bank balances (including short term deposits) with original maturities of 90 days or less. The current term deposits have an interest yield of 5.1% and 6%.

Revenue recognition

Revenue is measured at the fair value of the consideration received or receivable for the sale of goods and services, excluding goods and services tax rebates and discounts, to the extent it is probable that the economic benefits will flow to the entity and revenue can be reliably measured.

Sales of services are recognised in the period by reference to the stage of completion of the transaction at the end of the reporting period.

Interest received is recognised as interest accrues.

Plant and equipment

Plant and equipment are stated at historical cost less any accumulated depreciation and impairment losses. Historical cost includes expenditure directly attributable to the acquisition of assets, and includes the cost of replacements that are eligible for capitalisation when these are incurred.

An item of plant and equipment is derecognised upon disposal or when no further future economic benefits are expected from its use or disposal. Any gain or loss arising on derecognition of the asset (calculated as the difference between the net disposal proceeds and the carrying amount of the asset) is included in profit or loss in the year the asset is derecognised.

Plant and equipment is depreciated on a diminishing value basis, with rates between 20%-40%.

Changes in Accounting Policies

This Performance Report has been prepared in accordance with PBE SFR-A (NFP) Public Benefit Entity Simple Format Reporting - Accrual (Not-For-Profit), which is a change from previous years when the accounts have been prepared on a Special Purpose basis. This change has reordered the presentation of the statements, but no specific accounting policies have changed. Policies have been applied on a consistent basis with those of the previous reporting period.


Other than in our capacity as assurance practitioner we have no relationship with, or interests in, Bowls Taranaki Incorporated.
